Learning about logistics is crucial because it helps businesses efficiently manage the movement of goods and services, ensuring they reach the right



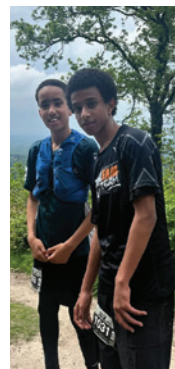
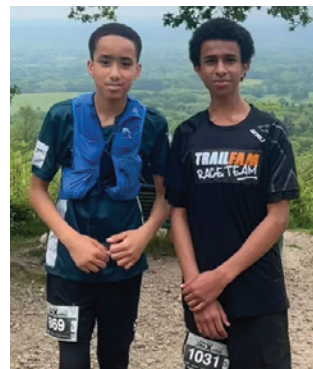

Sports Society

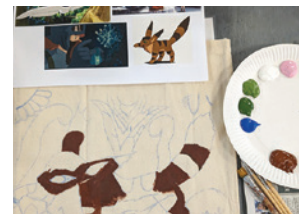
For our new Sports society's first trip on Thursday, students went to Lords to watch the armed forces day cricket match!

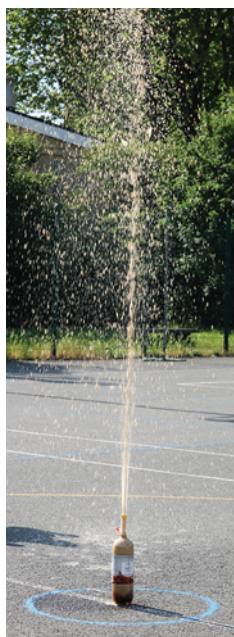

Careers conference with Mercedes Benz Grand Prix



This week, all of our Y10 and Y12 STEM Academy students attended the careers conference at the School for Girls. Students heard from three different engineers, including the head of mechanical design, a programme planner and an aerodynamicist, from Mercedes F1 AMG. It was an inspiring afternoon hearing about the wide range of careers within engineering! Students asked brilliant questions about the motivation for becoming engineers, what a day in the life looks like and their favorite parts of the job!

MATHS PROBLEM OF THE WEEK

Did you manage to solve the maths problem this week?

If $(a \times b=2)$, $(b \times c=24)$, $(c \times a=3)$ and (a,b) and c are all positive, what is the value of $(a+b+c)$?

ANSWER: 10.5

From the three equations we see that $(abc)^2 = 2 \times 24 \times 3 = 144$ and so, since abc is positive, $abc = 12$. Then the third equation tells us that $a = \frac{1}{2}$, the second that $b = 4$ and the first that $c = 6$. Therefore $a + b + c = 10\frac{1}{2}$.
